Student information

It is therefore vitally important that you read and understand the information in this booklet, before returning to school next week.

The school day

8.30	Students arrive and begin online learning until P1 begins
9.00 - 10.00	Period 1
10.00 - 11.00	Period 2
11.00 - 11.15	Break time. No food service is available therefore you must bring your own drinks and snacks.
11.15 - 12.15	Period 3
12.15 - 12.45	Lunch. No food service is available therefore you must bring your own drinks and lunch.
12.45 - 1.45	Period 4
1.45 - 2.00	Break and hand washing.
2.00 - 3.00	Period 5
3.00	End of the school day. You will be dismissed in a staggered format to ensure social distancing.

Arrival and departure from school

On arrival at school, you must go straight to the main reception, as the usual gate by the sports hall will be locked.

If there are several students arriving at the same time you will need to stand on one of the yellow dots to ensure social distancing.

When you arrive at reception, you will be registered and you must use the hand sanitiser on entry.


From here you will go directly to wash your hands at the toilet that is nearest your designated classroom. This room will be made clear to you on arrival.

After which you will go straight to your designated classroom.

At the end of the day you will be dismissed at staggered times to allow social distancing.

You must maintain the 2 metre distance as you leave school and as make your way home.

If waiting for a school bus you must line up keeping the 2 metre distancing and have your face covering ready to wear when on the bus.



Rooms, corridors, entrances and break times

You need to completely forget about the usual routes around school as these have changed.

At all times you must follow the one-way signs that are at entrances and in corridors. This may mean that you go through the internal doors within corridors that are usually locked to students.



Try not to touch the bannisters when going up and down stairs.


If at any point you have to queue for anything within school, e.g. entering the classroom or waiting for the toilet, you must stand by the 2 metre white lines that are clearly marked on the floor.



On entering the classroom you will be instructed to sit at a numbered desk. You must remain at this desk throughout the lesson to ensure social distancing.

The red block, sports hall and refectory are out of bounds. You should only visit the classroom you are working in and the nearest toilet to it within school.

At break time and lunchtime you must maintain a 2 metre distance from others whilst on the courtyard at all times.



Behaviour and expectations

Lockdown means we need to have clear regulations in place about how we will all behave. There is no room for error – not following these rules can put people's health at risk. We are relying on each of you.

Student Code of Conduct Agreement

By attending school, students agree the following:

Adhere to the normal full school uniform policy.

Bring your own drinks/snacks/lunch and equipment for the lessons.

Enter school through the main reception using the 2 metre yellow spots.

Use the hand sanitiser on entry and when registered wash your hands at the toilets closest to you designated classroom.

Use the one way system which is clearly signposted within school at all times.

Remain seated at your allocated desk at all times unless instructed.

Ensure you maintain a 2 metre distance when on the courtyard at break and lunchtime.

Wash your hands for at least 20 seconds before and after break/lunch and when instructed by your teacher.

You are here to learn and focus on understanding your work. There will be normal classroom expectations regarding work, effort and classroom behavior.

Leave school when directed maintaining a 2 metre distance (this also includes when you leave the school site).

Health and Hygiene

Social distancing (2m) must be followed at all times. This includes before school and at break times.

You must wash your hands at the start and end of every break/lunch time.

Bring all of your own equipment as items cannot be shared.

There will be no water fountains available so make sure you've plenty of water.


No food will be on sale at school so you must have a packed lunch. No sharing of food items is allowed with friends.

Only use the toilets you have been assigned.

Absolutely no physical contact with each other.

If you feel unwell at any point, you must immediately inform the nearest staff member.



The most important symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19)

If **you have symptoms** of coronavirus, you need to **self-isolate for 7 days**

If **you live with someone who has symptoms**, you need to **self-isolate for 14 days** from the day their symptoms started

For most people coronavirus will be a mild illness. However if you have any of the symptoms you should self-isolate at home

Stop the spread of coronavirus



Wash your hands more often and for 20 seconds

Use soap and water or a hand sanitiser when you:

- Get home or into work
- Blow your nose, sneeze or cough
- Eat or handle food



Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze and throw the tissue away straight away



Supervise young children to ensure they wash their hands more often than usual

Clean and disinfect regularly touched objects and surfaces more often than usual using your **standard cleaning products**



Staff, young people and children should stay at home if they are unwell with a new, continuous cough or a high temperature or loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell **to avoid spreading infection to others**

If staff, young people or children become unwell with any of the coronavirus symptoms on site, **they should be sent home**

We are asking schools, colleges, nurseries, childminders and other registered childcare settings **to remain open for children of critical workers and vulnerable children** where they can
